



### **GENDER**




"From this initial demographics report, it is clear that female RegF personnel have greater caregiver responsibilities than their male counterparts. A higher proportion of female RegF members are single parents, caring for a disabled child or caring for an elderly parent compared to the total RegF proportional female to male ratio (15%:85%)."



### **LOCATION**

Of RegF personnel and their families posted in Canada, almost 40% live in Ontario.



Nova Scotia has the highest percentage of military family members at 2% of the total provincial population.

One-third of all RegF personnel posted in Canada and their families live near CFSU Ottawa, CFB Halifax and 2 CDSB Valcartier.



#### MERGING DEMOGRAPHICS AND RESEARCH

CAF members aged 30-34 have the most 0-5 year olds. Deployments / repeated op-tempo related absences can affect this age group significantly (e.g. emergency child care requirements, attachment). Therefore, efforts should be considered to reduce the number of absences required by CAF members with children under the age of 5.

CAF members aged 40-44 have the most adolescents. When relocating, adolescents struggle more socially and academically. Therefore, efforts should be considered to reduce the number of relocations required by CAF members with children over the age of 13.

### **FAMILY PERSONA DEMOGRAPHICS**

'Despite the fact that most of the existing research and demographics focus on the military family as a single entity (e.g. examined as a common unit), families are not a single distinct entity. Military families come in all different sizes and shapes, each with different needs and strengths.

Different supports will be required by each of these different family types or "personas"."

"It is recognized that the breakdown of family "personas" by age of children (0-5; 6-12; 13-25) does not reflect those families who have children in multiple age groups. These age groupings were chosen specifically to better highlight major issues that arise within the various age groups (e.g. child care; school transitions - elementary, secondary, post-secondary; major developmental stages - transitions to adolescence, young adulthood, etc.). Given high school graduation requirements and post-secondary education entrance are major challenges when families are required to relocate to a new province, the mature family with youth "persona" includes both high school and post-secondary age groups (13-18 and 19-25)."

### **FAMILY PERSONA DEMOGRAPHICS**

Some families have unique characteristics that may require additional supports. Limited demographic data are currently available for some of these unique characteristics. Conditional demographic profiles are presented for families with special needs children, caring for elderly parents, single parents and dual service couples. Other family personas that require additional research include couples without children, empty nesters, families transitioning to Veteran status, same sex couples and families in breakdown. "A higher proportion of female RegF members posted in Canada are single parents (24% of all single parents are female and 76% are male which, as a proportion of the overall 15%-85% ratio of female-to-male RegF personnel, is significantly higher. Of all RegF personnel caring for a disabled child, 28% are female, which is almost double the overall female-to-male ratio of the RegF. Those who declared a dependent elderly parent, 24% are female RegF personnel, again much higher than the overall 15%-85% female-to-male ratio of the RegF."
