#MyVoice Tangible Impact: Treasury Board Changes Policy

> As a result of comments on #MyVoice and those of families before, Children's Education Management has been able to have Treasury Board approve tutoring for military children returning from OUTCAN.

Tutoring Services Now Available for Returning OUTCAN Children

Dependent children of Canadian Armed Forces members who recently returned to Canada after a foreign posting are now eligible for tutoring services.

Starting on September 1, 2015 students who have academic deficiencies as a result of being posted with their families outside Canada may be eligible for tutoring in the subjects they are struggling with. The Treasury Board Secretariat has recently approved tutoring assistance for the first year after the family's return to Canada.

Children's Education Management continues to encourage military families to communicate with the school board at their new posting, upon the initial receipt of a posting message back into Canada, to lessen the impact of relocation on student success.
